What to Bring

- Passport and a photocopy of your passport
- QR code from https://eticket.migracion.gob.do/. This is needed for coming and going. Please see hammonsmission.org website for directions on how to complete this document. You can screen shot the 2 QR codes (coming and going) on your phone, or print out a paper copy of both QR codes.
- Suggestion: pack a simple set of essential clothes and personal items in your carry-on luggage. (just
 in case)
- 1. Personal Hygiene items (hotel will provide towels, but no wash clothes)
- 2. Prescription drugs: If you take prescription drugs, please bring enough with the prescription for the entire trip.
- 3. No Tobacco Products

If you forget something, Santiago has many modern stores that can accommodate most needs.

Miscellaneous

1. Money: Each person will need between: \$150 to \$200

Meals in Airports

2 to 3 Meals in the evening in Santiago

2. Cell Phones do work in the Dominican Republic; however, you will want to turn off your data plan when you arrive to prevent international roaming charges. Check with your carrier prior to leaving the US for rates and make sure you have an international plan.

- 3. The Hotel provides free "Wi-Fi" in the lobby and hallways.
- 4. Electrical outlets are the same as the US.
- 5. Credit Cards do work in the Dominican Republic, sometimes, you must call your bank and let them know you will be using your credit card in the DR otherwise they will block your card after the first purchase.

Finally, remember to bring a good attitude and be flexible. You are going to be a blessing to the Dominican and Haitian people. Please be patient, and display the Love of Christ to everyone.
